The Canvass of the November 6, 2012 General Election was presented with the following results:

For the office of President/Vice President of the United States there were twelve thousand nine hundred fifty (12,950) votes cast as follows: Mitt Romney/Paul Ryan received eight thousand five hundred ninety-seven (8,597) votes; Barack Obama/Joe Biden received four thousand one hundred sixty-four (4,164) votes; Virgil Goode/James Clymer received fourteen (14) votes; Jill Stein/Cheri Honkala received twenty-nine (29) votes; Gary Johnson/James P.Gray received eighty-nine votes; Gloria LaRiva/Stefanie Beacham received one (1) vote; James Harris/Alyson Kennedy received seven (7) votes; Jerry Litzel/Jim Litzel received four (4) votes; scattering received forty-five (45) votes.

For the office of U.S. House of Representatives District 4 there were twelve thousand seven hundred seventy-four (12,774) votes cast as follows: Steve King received eight thousand six hundred fifteen (8,615) votes; Christie Vilsack received three thousand nine hundred seventy-three (3,973) votes; Martin James Monroe received one hundred seventy-five (175) votes; scattering received eleven (11) votes.

For the office of State Senator District 2 there were three hundred forty-nine (349) votes cast as follows: Randy Feenstra received three hundred forty-nine (349) votes.

For the office of State Representative District 3 there were three hundred fifty-nine (359) votes cast as follows: Dan Huseman received three hundred fifty-nine (359) votes.

For the office of State Representative District 5 there were nine thousand seven hundred sixty-nine (9,769) votes cast as follows: Chuck Soderberg received nine thousand seven hundred nine (9,709) votes; scattering received sixty (60) votes.

For the office of County Supervisor, District 2 there were ten thousand sixty-six (10,066) votes cast as follows: Mark R. Loutsch received ten thousand eleven (10,011) votes; scattering received fifty-five (55) votes. We therefore declare Mark. R. Loutsch duly elected for the office of County Supervisor, District 2 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of County Supervisor, District 3 there were nine thousand eight hundred eighty-five (9,885) votes cast as follows: Don Kass received nine thousand eight hundred thirty-four (9,834) votes; scattering received fifty-one (51) votes. We therefore declare Don Kass duly elected for the office of County Supervisor, District 3 for the term of 2 years.

For the office of County Supervisor, District 5 there were nine thousand nine hundred twenty-two (9,922) votes cast as follows: Jim Henrich received nine thousand eight hundred eighty-one (9,881) votes; scattering received forty-one (41) votes. We therefore declare Jim Henrich duly elected for the office of County Supervisor, District 5 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of County Auditor there were ten thousand two (10,002) votes cast as follows: Stacey Feldman received nine thousand nine hundred seventy-three (9,973) votes; scattering received twenty-nine (29) votes. We therefore declare Stacey Feldman duly elected for the office of County Auditor for the term of 4 years.

For the office of County Sheriff there were ten thousand six hundred ninety-four (10,694) votes cast as follows: Mike Van Otterloo received ten thousand five hundred sixty (10,560) votes; scattering received one hundred thirty-four (134) votes. We therefore declare Mike Van Otterloo duly elected for the office of County Sheriff for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Fredonia Township Trustee there were one hundred seven (107) votes cast as follows: Jerry Reuter received one hundred seven (107) votes. We therefore declare Jerry Reuter duly elected to the office of Fredonia Twp Trustee for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Soil & Water District Commission there were eighteen thousand nine hundred seven (18,907) votes cast as follows: Sandra Kay Fravel received five thousand seven hundred sixteen (5,716) votes; Tony Schroeder received seven thousand one hundred ten (7,110) votes; Steven Tonsfeldt received six thousand twenty-eight (6,028) votes; scattering received fifty-three (53) votes. We therefore declare Sandra Kay Fravel, Steven Tonsfeldt, Tony Schroeder duly elected for the office of Soil & Water District Commission for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Co. Agricultural Extension Council there were twenty-six thousand sixty (26,060) votes cast as follows: Alex Popken received four thousand seven hundred two (4,702) votes; Yvette Bowen received two thousand one hundred one (2,101) votes; Pat Lehner received five thousand two hundred eighty-eight (5,288) votes; Brad Harvey received four thousand nine hundred ninety-six (4,996) votes; Deb Baldwin received three thousand five hundred one (3,501) votes; Cindy Klemme received five thousand four hundred twenty-five (5,425) votes; scattering received forty-seven (47) votes. We therefore declare Alex Popken, Brad Harvey, Cindy Klemme, Pat Lehner duly elected for the office of Co. Agri. Extension Council for the term of 4 years.
