The Plymouth County Board of Supervisors met in the Boardroom on September 13, 2013 at 9:30 a.m. for the purpose of canvassing the Plymouth County School Board election. Present was Chairman Jim Henrich, Don Kass, Mark Loutsch and Craig Anderson. Absent was Jack E. Guenther.

Motion by Kass, seconded by Anderson, to approve the canvass of the 2013 School Board Election as presented:

AKRON-WESTFIELD

For the office of Director District 1 there were sixty-one (61) votes cast as follows: Nicholas Schoenfelder received fifty-nine (59) votes; scattering received two (2) votes.

We therefore declare Nicholas Schoenfelder duly elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 2 there were fifty-seven (57) votes cast as follows: Phillip Parks received fifty-seven (57) votes.

We therefore declare Phillip Parks duly elected for the office of Director District 2 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 3 there were sixty-one (61) votes cast as follows: Bobby Walrod received fifty-nine (59) votes; scattering received two (2) votes.

We therefore declare Bobby Walrod duly elected for the office of Director District 3 for the term of 4 years.

HINTON

For the offices of Director At Large there were two hundred sixty (260) votes cast as follows: James D. Binneboese received eighty-one (81) votes; Robert Held received sixty-nine (69) votes; John Reintzel received ninety-two (92) votes; scattering received eighteen (18) votes.

We therefore declare James D. Binneboese and John Reintzel each duly elected for the office of Director At Large for the term of 4 years.

KINGSLEY-PIERSON

For the offices of Director District At Large there were one hundred sixty (160) votes cast as follows: Scott Bohle received sixty-six (66) votes; Bart Boustead received twenty-two (22) votes; Blake Laddusaw received thirty-one (31) votes; Shari Seuntjens received twenty-five (25) votes; scattering received sixteen (16) votes.

We therefore declare Scott Bohle and Blake Laddusaw each duly elected for the office of Director District At Large for the term of 4 years.

LEMARS COMMUNITY

For the office of Director District 1 there were five hundred fifteen (515) votes cast as follows: Todd Lancaster received five hundred fourteen (514) votes; scattering received one (1) vote.

We therefore declare Todd Lancaster duly elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 2 there were five hundred nine (509) votes cast as follows: Scott Kommes received five hundred seven (507) votes; scattering received two (2) votes.

We therefore declare Scott Kommes duly elected for the office of Director District 2 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 3 there were five hundred eighty-seven (587) votes cast as follows: Cris Collins received three hundred forty-five (345) votes; Mark Hemmingson received two hundred forty-two (242) votes. We therefore declare Cris Collins duly elected for the office of Director District 3 for 2 years of a 4 year term.

For the office of Director District 4 there were five hundred seven (507) votes cast as follows: Brenda Phelan received five hundred five (505) votes; scattering received two (2) votes. We therefore declare Brenda Phelan duly elected for the office of Director District 4 for the term of 4 years.

For the public measure “ Shall the money received by the LeMars Community School District from the State of Iowa Secure an Advanced Visions for Education fund may be used for infrastructure purposes and needs for the LeMars Community School District?

There were five hundred fifty (550) votes cast as follows:

FOR the question, there were four hundred eight-nine (489) votes.

AGAINST the questions, there were sixty-one (61) votes.

We therefore declare the public measure to be adopted.

REMSEN-UNION

For the offices of Director District At Large there were nine hundred forty-two (942) votes cast as follows: Melissa M. Harnack received one hundred thirty-one (131) votes; Cheri A. Nitzschke received ninety-seven (97) votes; Michael E. Sparr received two hundred twenty-two (222) votes; Travis J. Tentinger received one hundred thirty-eight (138) votes; Theresa Van Dam received one hundred seventy-six (176) votes; Robin S. Weiler received one hundred seventy-six (176) votes; scattering received two (2) votes.

We therefore declare Michael E. Sparr, Theresa Van Dam, and Robin S. Weiler each duly elected for the office of Director District At Large for the term of 4 years.

WESTERN IOWA TECH COMMUNITY COLLEGE

For the office of Community College Director District 1 there were six hundred forty-six (646) votes cast as follows: Neal Adler received six hundred forty (640) votes; scattering received six (6) votes.

For the office of Community College Director District 8 there were sixty-three (63) votes cast as follows: Russell C. Wray received sixty-two (62) votes; scattering received one (1) vote.
